

Site Preparations Continue at Cloverleafs along Route 123 In Preparation for the Dulles Rail Project

Work will begin July 3 in three cloverleafs along the northwest side of Route 123 between the Dulles Toll Road/Dulles Connector Road Bridge and Tysons Boulevard, in preparation for the future construction of the Dulles Corridor Metrorail Project. The work is scheduled to begin on July 3 and continue through July 8, weather permitting.

Sections of trees and vegetation will be removed and roots removed within the cloverleafs at these locations:

- 1. The cloverleaf on the northwest side of Route 123 at I-495 that is within the access ramp from southbound Route 123 to I-495 south.
- 2. The cloverleaf on the northwest side of Route 123 at I-495 that is within the access ramp from I-495 to southbound Route 123.

(Both of these sites are owned by the Virginia Department of Transportation.)

Tree clearings will also take place along Route 123 from the Dulles Airport Access Road bridge south toward Anderson Road. This work is being done in a cloverleaf at the access ramp from southbound Route 123 to the eastbound lanes of the Dulles Connector Road leading to I-66. The land is owned by the Metropolitan Washington Airports Authority.

The work is limited to land that is needed for utility work.

The Dulles Corridor Metrorail Project is being managed by the Metropolitan Washington Airports Authority.
