Utility Relocation on Route 7 Service Road

Motorists should expect some delays near Gosnell Road

Motorists who use the service road along the south side of Route 7 in Tysons Corner are advised that a section of the road in front of Business Bank will be closed for a week beginning May 12 at Gosnell Road. Both east-bound and west-bound traffic in the service road will be blocked for 110 feet east of the Gosnell/Route 7 intersection, according to the Metropolitan Washington Airports Authority. Entrances to the bank and into the Pike Seven Shopping Center will remain open.

Washington Gas has been working in that area of Route 7 for several months relocating utilities in preparation for the future construction of the Dulles Corridor Metrorail Project.

Variable message signs will be placed in the area to alert motorists to traffic pattern changes on the service road and into businesses. The work will be done weather permitting.

Additional utility relocations for phones, fiber, electric, water, sewer and sanitary drainage lines will follow. The utility relocations are expected to take about two years.
